

About thirty years ago, I studied English at a junior high school in America for three weeks. In my English class, Mr. Johnson, our teacher, taught me English\*grammar. He was a cheerful and kind man. My English was not good, but it was easy for me to understand the English which he taught.

When he taught me how to use \*gerunds, he gave me some questions. For example, "What do you like doing?" I wrote an answer, "I like play tennis very much." Mr. Johnson said, "I like playing tennis very much." My answer was wrong. He \*pointed out the mistake. I said to him, "I always make mistakes when I write English. It's not good to make mistakes. I have to study more." Mr. Johnson said, "Why do you think so? You're a student. Students usually make mistakes. If you make mistakes, you \*only have to write \*correct answers next time. No problem! Make a lot of mistakes!" I knew that there were different ideas between Japan and America. I was happy after the class.

When my answer was wrong, my Japanese English teacher sometimes\*scolded me. The teacher said, "Why do you make a mistake? You don't study hard. Study harder." These words made me sad.

I learned important things from Mr. Johnson. Making mistakes is necessary to learn English. So, you don't have to worry. Let's do it!

"The Lake Towada Summer Festival" is held every July. There are some events like food stalls, fireworks and walking around the lake at the festival. Many visitors and \*local people go there every year. Watching the fireworks from a ship is the most popular event.

Hiroshi loved it and visited there every year. But, the festival\*was canceled because of \*COVID-19 in 2020. He \*was disappointed when he watched the news on TV in July. Many festivals and events were canceled all around Japan. One day, when he watched the news on TV, he found an alternative event at Lake Towada at the end of August. The alternative event was called "\*The Sky Lantern Festival." He was so excited when he \*checked it on the Internet. The alternative event was different from the usual summer festival. Only people living in Aomori prefecture were able to join the event and\*fly lanterns in the night sky.

Sky lantern festivals are popular in Thailand and China. Many people at sky lantern festivals write a wish on a lantern and fly it into the night sky. Also, sky lantern events \*have grown in Japan. The alternative event held at Lake Towada was also an event to write a wish on a lantern and fly ① it into the night sky. Hiroshi decided to join the event with his family because he was interested in sky lantern festivals.

When they arrived at Lake Towada, many people were already there. Hiroshi's father said, "There are two colors of lanterns. If you want to pray for the calming of COVID-19, you use a blue lantern. If you want to write your own wish, you use an orange lantern." Hiroshi's younger brother bought an orange lantern and Hiroshi bought a blue lantern. His younger brother wrote, "I want to watch the fireworks from a ship next year." Hiroshi wrote, "I hope the COVID-19 situation will get better."

At 7:30 p.m., most of the people\*flew the lanterns\* at the same time. There were about 400 lanterns. Many orange lanterns and blue lanterns were in the night sky. Hiroshi hoped that all of the wishes come true someday.
